(b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation:

- 1.) The blinds in three (3) of the three (3) classrooms had several slats that were broken and the blinds contained a build-up of dust;
- 2.) The ceiling fans in three (3) of the three (3) classrooms had a heavy build-up of dust;
- 3.) The windowsills in three (3) of the three (3) classrooms contained dead flies, along with dirt and debris;
- 4.) The doorframe was loose, near the top of the door, on the door located in the entry to the two and three year old room;
- 5.) The linoleum tile in the school age room had an area that contained duct tape and was missing a tile;
- 6.) The bathroom vanity cabinet was missing two (2) knobs. Also, the vanity had streaked stains running down the surface of the cabinet; and
- 7.) There was no outside covering on the window air conditioning units.

560 - Building Requirements

- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:

General: Based on observation, the light in the restroom, located off the two-year-old room, was not shatterproof and did not have a protective covering.

General: Based on observation of the first supplies, there was no CPR mask / face shield available.
