922 KAR 2:405E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), certified family child care homes must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the center failed to create and post a cleaning and sanitizing plan specific to the individual family child care home and outline the additional cleaning and sanitizing requirements from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for child care during a pandemic, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 6 (1).
