- (a) Request that the prospective child care staff member provide a copy of his or her driver's license or other government-issued photo identification and verify that the photograph clearly matches the prospective child care staff member;
- (b) Request that the prospective child care staff member complete and sign the:
- 1. DCC-500, Applicant Child Care Staff Member Waiver Agreement and Statement; and
- 2. DCC-501, Disclosures to Be Provided to and Signed by the Applicant Child Care Staff Member; and
- (c) Log on to the NBCP portal and enter the prospective child care staff member's demographic information for a check of the:
- 1. Child abuse and neglect central registry pursuant to 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. National Crime Information Center's National Sex Offender Registry in accordance with 34 U.S.C. 20921; and
- 3. Sex Offender Registry established in accordance with KRS 17.500 through 17.580.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a review of the center's KARES report revealed a caregiver hired on 1/19/22, did not submit fingerprints. The caregiver was present at the center in the toddlers' room.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 10/30/20, had TB documentation on file that was dated 2/5/20. A caregiver hired on 1/19/22, did not have TB documentation on file.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 1/25/21, did not complete first aid and CPR training.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 3/8/21, completed six (6) hours of orientation on 11/10/21. A caregiver hired on 1/25/21, had an orientation certificate on file dated 11/26/21, but was not entered in ECE-TRIS. Also, the caregiver did not complete any training hours during the first year of employment, which included Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma Training.

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled on 7/12/21, had a vaccine list on file and the document did not include a validity date.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled on 5/11/21, did not include a physician's name and phone number in the enrollment information. Two (2) children enrolled on 5/11/21 and 7/12/21, did not include their health medical history, allergies, and restrictions in the enrollment information. A child enrolled on 1/10/22, did not include the parental contact information in the enrollment information.
