General: Based on observation, a bottle of hand sanitizer was stored on a table located at the entrance of the center. A caregiver's jacket hung on a hook by the door that led to the playground in the preschool room. These items were accessible to children.

- 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;
- 3. Before and after diapering each child;
- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;

General: Based on observation, a caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water before she diapered an infant child in the infants' room.

A caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water each time after she wiped three (3) toddler children's noses in the toddlers' room.

A caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water each time after she wiped two (2) children's noses in the two-year-olds' room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a different can of powder formula was in the cabinet in the infants' room. Interviews determined an infant's parent provided the can of formula and caregivers prepared bottles for the infant each time the infant was fed in the infants' room. The caregivers measured the formula and water and combined them together in a bottle.
