General: Based on observation, it was found that the electrical cords to two (2) infant swings were plugged into a lower outlet in the classroom. The cords were accessible to the children in care.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found a staff person hired on 3/25/19 had TB documentation on file dated 4/28/19. Based on the documentation presented for review, the staff person acquired the TB documentation after she was hired.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the child-care center failed to meet this regulation as follows:

- 1). Three (3) staff (hire dates: 5/25/05, 8/6/07, and 1/15/12) have not renewed the Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training.
- 2). Two (2) staff (hire dates: 6/5/18 and 9/24/18) completed orientation training on 3/9/19 which is past the ninety day period.
- 3). Six (6) staff (hire dates: 5/25/05, 1/15/12, 9/10/15, 4/4/17, 5/25/17, 6/5/18) did not complete fifteen (15) hours of early care and education training.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found that there were two (2) torn nap mats in the Twos classroom and five (5) torn nap mats in the Ones classroom. The mats are used by the children at nap time.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found that the seat of a plastic riding toy was cracked and broken. The toy was located on the Infant/Toddler playground. The cracked plastic seat left sharp edges and posed a pinching risk to the children.
