Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Upon entry into the child care center, there was one (1) staff member present in the school-age classroom, with fifteen (15) children. Interview with staff revealed the children ranged in age from four to twelve years old. Continued observation revealed one (1) staff member present with eleven (11) children in the two-year-old classroom.

- (i) Conduct, manage, and document in writing recurring staff meetings;

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that more than one (1) staff meeting had been conducted and documented in writing within the last year.

- (j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification of the evaluations assessing the staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance for eight (8) of the ten (10) employees eligible.

- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee's records in accordance with regulatory requirements.

- 1) Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the personnel files for ten (10) of the ten (10) employees eligible had met the requirement of Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment.
- 2) Continued review revealed the employees with the hire dates of 10/06/2017, 06/05/2018, 08/20/2018 and 01/02/2019 had not completed new employee orientation from a cabinet approved source within the first three (3) months of employment.
- 3) The following employees with the hire dates of 1/25/2011, 09/06/2017, 10/06/2017,03/22/2018,06/04/2018 and 06/05/2018 had not completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training within the first year of employment.

Review of documentation in the ECE-TRIS training system revealed the above-mentioned staff members had not completed the training.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the daily activity of programming was posted to include the activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served in the school-age, two-year-old and infant classrooms.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with programming requirements. A nine- month-old infant was observed in their crib, that included several toys, a loose blanket and a pacifier with an attached clip.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Located in the school-age restroom on the metal shelf, accessible to the children was a can of Spray Disinfectant. The can was labeled "Keep out of the reach of children". Therefore, the disinfect spray was accessible.

- 2.) There were several small holes in the restroom located off the school age room that contained drywall that was flaking.
- 3.)The baseboard trim in the school age restroom was separated from the wall under the urinal with exposed dried glue.
- 4.) The vanity located in the one-year-old classrrom had a sinktop that was not securely fastened to the vanity.

- 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon entry into the infant classroom, it was observed that there were three (3) infants sleeping in bouncy seats for an undetermined amount of time. Therefore, the infants were not provided with appropriate equipment for sleeping.

Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the record of the children with the enrollment dates of 09/03/2017,11/11/2017,08/18/2018 and 12/04/2018 contained a current immunication record.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that individual job descriptions had been maintained for the child care center.

1160 - Daily Attendance Records

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (c) Daily attendance records documenting the arrival and departure time of each child, including records that are required in accordance with 922 KAR 2:160, Section 13, if a child receives services from the child-care center through the Child Care Assistance Program;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that all of the children had been signed in on the daily attendance record for 07/17/2019. Review of the documentation revealed forty-one (41) children had been signed in on the attendance record. Observation revealed fifty—eight (58) children present. Continued review revealed that eighteen (18) of the forty-one (41) children's parents had verified the child's attendance in advance as evidenced by the signature of the parent or designated person on the DCC -94E form.

1175 - Earthquake/Tornado/Fire Drills

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the fire drills conducted for the months of February and April of 2019, listed the names of the children that participated.

- (c) Each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year;
- (d) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's Website as specified in KRS 199.897;
- (e) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including:
- 1. Current rates for child care; and
- 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to post documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the requirement that each statement of deficiency issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year and each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year was readily accessible for public inspection.
