General: Based on observation, the blue wall in the two-year-old restroom had a large area where the paint had peeled away and the drywall was exposed.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements. (4) A child shall:

- (a) Be helped with personal care and cleanliness based upon his or her developmental skills;
- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation in the two-year-old classroom, the employee completed a diaper change of a toddler, then placed the toddler off the changing table and allowed the toddler to play without washing his/her hands.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the staff member in the two-year-old classroom was observed changing a diaper. Upon completion, the staff member did not maintain personal cleanliness by washing his/her hands with liquid soap and water after diapering a child.

General: Observation of the sleeping mats located in the four-year-old classroom revealed the corner of three (3) of the mats were worn with the inside material exposed.

General: Based on observation, at 010:20 a.m. there were three (3) infants sleeping in separate cribs that were placed edge to edge; therefore, the cribs were not spaced twelve (12) inches apart to allow free and safe movement by a person.
