General: Based on Review of Documentation, a child, first date of attendance on 08/03/15, two (2) children, first date of attendance on 08/05/15, a child, first date of attendance on 08/06/15, and two (2) children, first date of attendance on 08/03/16, did not have information on file to enable the person in charge to contact the child's preferred hospital. A child, first date of attendance on 08/03/16, did not have information on file to enable the person in charge to contact the child's physician.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, quarterly practiced earthquake drills and tornado drills were conducted in the third and fourth quarters of 2016, but the names of children participants were not documented.

- (i) A written record of practiced fire drills conducted monthly detailing the date, time, and children who participated in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120, Section 3;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, monthly practiced fire drills were conducted September through December 2016, but the names of the children participants were not documented.

1140 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

- (a) At least monthly; and
- (b) Documented.

General: Based on interview, a monthly practiced fire drill was conducted in August 2016 but was not documented.
