General: Based on interview, the center had only one (1) substitute staff person available in case of need.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled on 10/14/21, did not include a preferred hospital, a name of a physician, and the physician's phone number in the enrollment information. Two (2) children enrolled on 10/13/20 and 8/21/21, did not include a name of an individual to be contacted in case of an emergency involving the child in the enrollment information. A child enrolled on 11/15/21, did not include a preferred hospital in the enrollment information.
