General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request a current copy of regulations was not presented for review. The regulations that were presented were dated for 2015.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (e) A current personnel file for each child-care center staff person to include:
- 1. Name, address, date of birth, and date of employment;
- 2. Proof of educational qualifications;
- 3. Record of annual performance evaluation;
- 4. Documentation of compliance with tuberculosis screening in accordance with Section 11(1)(b) of this administrative regulation; and
- 5. The results of background checks conducted in accordance with 922 KAR 2:280;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of staff files revealed files for two (2) staff members with the hire dates 9/1/97 and 3/11/19 did not contain the background check. Review of a KARES report revealed both aforementioned staff members are eligible for employment.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, a high school diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential was not presented for review for a staff member with the hire date 5/8/17.

410 - Training **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, documentation to verify that two (2) staff members with the hire dates 9/1/97 and 7/11/14 completed fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training was not presented for review. Review of the ECE TRIS report did not verify that the training hours had been completed

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, a current immunization certificate was not presented for a child with the enrollment date 8/4/18.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of ten (10) children's files revealed one (1) file did not contain the information for the parents' preferred hospital.

Upon request, the child care center did not present a written record of practiced fire, earthquake and tornado drills with the time documented for each one from May 2018 to March 2019.
