General: Based on Review of Documentation, a staff, hired on 07/18/16, did not have education verification on file.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a staff, hired on 01/19/15, completed seven and a half (7 ½) hours of cabinet approved training during the first year of employment. A staff, hired on 03/24/08, completed six (6) hours of cabinet approved training during a subsequent year of employment. A staff, hired on 06/28/10, completed nine (9) hours of cabinet approved training hours during the subsequent year of employment approved training hours during the subsequent year of employment.

General: Based on Observation, an infant slept in a crib with a bib around his neck and a pacifier clip in the crib in the infants' room. Also, an infant slept in a crib with a small plush toy attached to his pacifier in the infants' room.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a caregiver's fleece jacket hung on the back of a rocking chair in the infants' room. A caregiver's purse was on a portable file, which was located below the window, in the four-year-olds' room. A wadded up plastic bag was stored in an unlocked drawer in the four-year-olds' room. A large roll of plastic trash bags was stored on the top of a plastic chest of drawers in the boys' restroom. A caregiver's jacket hung on the back of an adult-size chair in the three-year-olds' room. All of these items were accessible to children

General: Based on Observation, a caregiver washed her hands and then served water to eight (8) children from the same handwashing sink. The sink was not cleaned or sanitized in the four-year-olds' room.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a child, first date of attendance on 01/04/17; a child, first date of attendance on 07/01/14, and a child, first date of attendance on 01/07/16, each did not have information on file to enable the person in charge to contact the child's preferred hospital.
