1260 - Emergency Regulation

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the center failed to ensure machine washable toys shall not be used and all child care staff, directors, owners and operators complete a new, mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the date of reopening, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E. Five (5) stuffed body baby dolls were located in the two-year-olds' room. Two (2) stuffed body baby dolls were located in the three-year-olds' room. Also, two (2) bean bags were in the reading area located in the three-year-olds' room. A caregiver hired on 3/2/15, did not completed the mandatory training.
