- (a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and
- (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

General: Based on observation, blocks and toys were scattered across the floor while children colored at the table in the preschool A room. Also, blocks and toys were scattered across the floor in the preschool B room. The blocks and toys created a tripping hazard and were on each floor for approximately fifteen (15) minutes.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (m) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:280;

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 1/21/21, cared for four (4) infants alone in the infants' room and did not have background check results on file. The caregiver initiated the screening process in the National Background Check Program but did not submit fingerprints.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 12/18/19, did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training.

- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and
- (d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities including:

General: Based on observation, a daily planned program of activities was not developed and posted in the preschool B room.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, urine was present in an unflushed toilet bowel in the two and three-year-olds' room.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child: or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a tube of Desitin Healing Ointment and Neil Med Pedia Mist Saline Spray were not labeled to indicate to whom they belonged to in a locked cabinet in the infants' room.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a smoke detector chirped, which indicated the battery was low, in the two and three-year-olds' room.

- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:

- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled on 9/17/20, did not have information on file for staff to contact the child's physician.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, thirty-four (34) children were present, and six (6) children had a documented arrival time.

922 KAR 2:410E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the center failed to assure:

- 1.) Machine washable toys shall not be used, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:410E Section 6. A stuffed toy bunny and duck were in the preschool A room. A stuffed toy frog and doll were in the preschool B room. Five (5) stuffed toys were in the one-year-olds' room and infants' room. Three (3) stuffed toys were in the two-year-olds' room.
- 2.) Children and adults shall be screened for fever and contagious symptoms upon entry into the child care center each day and shall not be allowed to enter if displaying a contagious fever or symptom of COVID-19, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:410E Section 7. Children were not screened for fever and contagious symptoms on 10/29/20, and were last screened on 11/6/2020. Staff were last screened for a fever and contagious symptoms on 9/25/20.
- 3.) New background checks for staff who were employed at the time of the child care closure on Friday, March 20, 2020, shall not be required due to the rapback feature of the Kentucky National Background Check Program, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:410E Section 11. A caregiver hired on 1/21/21, initiated the rapback feature to obtain background checks through the National Background Check Program. However, the caregiver never submitted fingerprints and the determination status was noted in process. In addition, the caregiver cared for four (4) infants alone in the infants' room.
