Findings:

General: Based on interview, the director failed to assure the health, safety and comfort of a child on 8/8/12 during a diaper change when a bottle of liquid Lysol which was within reach of the child came open and splashed into the face of a one year old. Based on interview and record review, said child was engaged in reaching/ touching the bottle of Lysol during the diapering process and as a result, the bottle tipped over and the the harmful substance fell onto the child.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, a bottle of Lysol was stored within the reach of a child on 8/8/12. During a diaper change the child was able to touch the bottle, causing it to come open, splashing Lysol into his face.

Hygienic Practices

289 - Disinfect Diaper Surface

(12) Staff shall disinfect the diapering surface after each child is diapered.

Findings:

One Year Room: Based on observation, on 8/21/12 approximately 10:50 a.m. at the completion of a diaper change, staff sprayed the surface of the diaper change table with Lysol, then immediately wiped the surface dry with a paper towel. Review of the product label revealed staff failed to follow the recommended procedure for disinfecting surfaces which indicated that the product should be sprayed on the surface, allowed to remain wet for ten minutes, then wiped dry.
