General: Based on review of documentation and interview, a child enrolled 10/22/20, had an immunization certificate from Missouri on file that did not have a date to indicate when the certificate was valid until. Two (2) children enrolled on 07/02/2020 and 08/24/20, did not have an immunization certificate on file. A child enrolled on 02/08/21, had an immunization certificate on file that was valid until 06/01/21. A child enrolled 05/27/19, had an immunization certificate on file that was valid until 05/17/21.
