Findings:

General: Based on Interview, a bottle warmer was sitting on a small refrigerator unit in the infant room, and was within reach of children. The plug to the warmer was behind the refrigerator and the child was able to access the cord and pull it, which resulted in another child getting burned on the top of her legs. The warmer was unplugged but had been used within the last few minutes to warm a bottle. The staff person in the room stated that she was changing a diaper across the room, and was unable to reach the child as she observed her pulling on the cord. The child that was burned was seated beside the refrigerator in a bouncy seat. The burned child was twelve (12) months old and received first and second degree burns on her leg and thigh.
