General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that a staff (DOH: 4/30/12) obtained a negative tuberculin result on 5/18/16; therefore, the result was no longer current as of 5/18/18. A copy of a current negative tuberculin result or statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis was not presented to the surveyor for review.

410 - Training **Not In Compliance** 

### 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found that a staff (DOH: 12/07/18) completed six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training on 3/9/18; thus, not within three (3) months of employment.

- (2) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section or Section 2(2)(c) of this administrative regulation, an infant or toddler under twentyfour (24) months of age shall not participate in an activity with an older child for no more than one (1) hour per day.
- (3) If a toddler is developmentally appropriate for a transition to a preschool age group, a toddler may participate in an activity with an older child for more than one (1) hour per day if:
- (a) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;
- (b) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child:
- (c) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with
- (d) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the childcare center, the surveyor found that one (1) staff person was providing care for six (6) children. Through interview with the staff, the surveyor learned that the children were one and two-year-old children and that they had been in the mixed-age group for longer than one (1) hour.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the childcare center, the surveyor found that a staff's purse was stored on a shelf of the computer table located in the kitchen. The kitchen is adjacent to the Preschool Room where six (6) three and four-year-old children were in attendance. The kitchen door was wide open; thus, the purse was within reach and

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (a) For an infant:
- 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. An approximate one (1) inch nonabsorbent pad/mattress did not properly fit a crib located in the Infant Room. A tightly fitting sheet covered the pad/mattress, which pulled both ends upward and off the crib base.
- 2. A crib contained two (2) approximate one (1) inch nonabsorbent pads/mattresses that were stacked and covered with a crib sheet. The pads/mattresses did not properly fit the crib located in the Infant Room.

Therefore, neither crib contained a firm crib mattress as required by regulations.

General: Based on observation during a tour of the childcare center on 3/15/19, the surveyor found that seventeen (17) children were present. Review of the daily attendance record found that only fifteen (15) of the children's arrival times were documented.
