General: Based on observation and interview, a caregiver supervised eleven (11) children from 9:10 a.m. until 9:58 a.m. and thirteen (13) children from 9:58 a.m. until 10:05 a.m. in the big kids' playroom. The age of the youngest child in the group was two-years-old.

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, an infant slept in a bouncy seat for approximately thirty-five (35) minutes in the infants' room. A signed waiver from a health professional that stated the infant required an alternate sleep position was not on file.

General: Based on observation, three (3) children did not wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water after they ate lunch in the big kid's playroom.

General: Based on review of documentation, a child first date of attendance on 01/25/2021, had an immunization certificate on file that did not have a validity date documented. A child first date of attendance on 08/10/2020, did not have an immunization certificate on file.

General: Based on review of documentation, a child first date of attendance on 04/30/2021, a child first date of attendance on 04/10/2021, and a child first date of attendance on 09/01/2020, each did not have allergy information documented in health status and medical history.
