Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the childcare center, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A plunger was on the floor beside the commode in the School-age classroom. The plunger was within reach and accessible to the children.
- 2. The surveyor observed a plunger in an unlocked cabinet located under the sink in a restroom used by the children. The plunger was within reach and accessible to the children.
- 3. Boards were leaned against the wall in the entry area of the childcare center. Children walk through this area to their classrooms; therefore, the boards presented a safety-risk to the children

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The surveyor found no verification that a staff (DOH: 10/28/19) has completed six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training.
- 2. The surveyor found that a staff (DOH: 9/30/19) completed six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training on 1/17/2020; thus, not within the first three (3) months of employment.
- 3. The surveyor found that a staff (DOH: 10/1/19) completed six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training on 1/17/2020; thus, not within the first three (3) months of employment.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation during a tour of the childcare center on 7/1/2020, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The Daily Planned Program posted in the School-age Room was dated 6/26/2020. Therefore, the Daily Planned Program was not current.
- 2. The Daily Planned Program posted in the Infant Room was dated 3/9/2020 through 3/13/2020. Therefore, the Daily Planned Program was not current.

Findings

General: Based on observation during a tour of the childcare center, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The surveyor observed water dripping from the ceiling onto the hallway floor adjacent to the Early Preschool Room following a very heavy rain. The ceiling tile was damaged and had dark stains. The ceiling/roof was not in good repair.
- 2. The surveyor observed two (2) areas of paint (approximately four (4) inches wide and two (2) inches long) peeled from the wall in the restroom used by the children located near the kitchen. The wall was not in good repair.

710 - Toy Sanitation Procedure Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (4) A toy or another item that is considered a mouth contact surface by a child not toilet trained shall be sanitized daily by:
- (a)1. Scrubbing in warm, soapy water using a brush to reach into crevices;
- 2. Rinsing in clean water;
- 3. Submerging in a sanitizing solution for at least two (2) minutes; and
- 4. Air dried; or
- (b) Cleaning in a dishwasher if the toy or other item is dishwasher safe.

Findings:

General: Based on interview with staff in the Infant Room, the surveyor learned that throughout the day, staff sanitizes the mouth contact toys by spraying them with a bleach water solution. After the toys air-dry, staff return them to the children. Staff are not following the proper sanitation procedures for the mouth contact toys.

- (4) A cold-storage facility used for storage of perishable food in a nonfrozen state shall:
- (a) Have an indicating thermometer or other appropriate temperature measuring device;
- (b) Be in a safe environment for preservation; and
- (c) Be forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found no thermometer inside the refrigerator located in the classroom for the one-year-old children. Therefore, the interior temperature of the refrigerator could not be determined. Staff confirmed that the refrigerator is for the children's use.
