#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, upon arrival, the Twos classroom was very loud and chaotic. There were eighteen (18) children and three (3) staff in the classroom. Several children were observed hitting, pinching and bitting other children. Many of the children were crying, some were running around the classroom, two (2) children were hiding under furniture and two (2) other children were taking off their shoes and socks. There were no toys on the shelves for the children. All of the toys were observed in a closet in the classroom. In an interview with staff it was stated that the toys are taken out of the closet after mid-morning snack. Staff were trying to get the children to hold onto a rope to "practice walking in a line" for their upcoming graduation. The children were not cooperating and did not seem to have any interest in the activity, however, staff kept insisting that the children hold onto the rope. After several minutes of that activity, one of the staff got a bin of musical instruments out of the closet. The staff person held up each instrument and asked the children, "Who wants this one?" During the distribution of the instruments, several children without instruments began grabbing, hitting and/or pinching the children with instruments in order to take the instrument for themselves.

## Findings:

General: Based on Observation, there was a bottle of correction fluid being stored in an unlocked drawer of the teacher's desk in the PT Fours classroom. The bottle's label instructed "Keep out of reach of children". The drawer and its contents was accessible to the children in care.
