Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) school-age children were not supervised when they walked out of the child-care room and went into a separate room in the provider's home for twenty-two (22) minutes. The children were not within range of voice or scope of vision. Interview determined these were the provider's own twelve-year-old children who were enrolled at the center. The children went to their own room to change their wet clothes after swimming.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the director failed to provide staff with a copy of the current administrative regulations. The copy on file had a print date of

- (e) Manage the staff in their individual job descriptions;
- (f) Assure the development, implementation, and monitoring of child-care center plans, policies, and procedures;
- (g) Supervise staff conduct to ensure implementation of program policies and procedures;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the center's discipline policy stated a child will be asked to cease whatever behavior is deemed inappropriate and will be given consequences such as time out, and a parent will be notified. The center's discipline policy was not followed when a child continued to move and scooted around on the carpet as the caregiver went over a lesson. The caregiver, who sat in a chair, put the feet of a child, who sat on the floor in front of the caregiver and had his legs crossed at the ankles, between her feet and told the child not to move. The caregiver maintained this position with the child's feet between her own feet for a minute.

General: Based on review of documentation, a staff, hired on 05/20/19, did not have education verification on file.

- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the director, hired on 08/04/05, had documentation of completing five (5) hours of cabinet approved training hours during a subsequent year of employment. A staff, hired on 06/04/04, had documentation of completing fourteen (14) hours of cabinet approved training hours during a subsequent year of employment. A staff, hired on 03/07/16, had documentation of completing fourteen and a half (14 ½) hours of cabinet approved training during a subsequent year of employment. A staff, hired on 05/17/18, had documentation of completing six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training on 04/13/19, which was not within the first three (3) months of employment. In addition, the staff, hired on 05/17/18, had documentation of completing four (4) hours of cabinet approved training within the first year of employment. A staff, hired on 03/06/18, had documentation of completing one and a half (1 ½) hours of cabinet approved training, during the first year of employment. In addition, a staff, hired on 03/06/18, had documentation of completing one and a half (1 ½) hours of cabinet approved training, during the first year of employment.

- (2) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section or Section 2(2)(c) of this administrative regulation, an infant or toddler under twenty-four (24) months of age shall not participate in an activity with an older child for no more than one (1) hour per day.
- (3) If a toddler is developmentally appropriate for a transition to a preschool age group, a toddler may participate in an activity with an older child for more than one (1) hour per day if:
- (a) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;
- (b) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child;
- (c) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with either age group; and
- (d) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a two-year-old toddler was combined with twelve (12) older children from 9:20 am and until 12:00 pm and was not in a transition program in the preschool room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver's cell phone, tanning oil and body spray were stored in an unlocked locker among lockers used by children. These items were accessible to children in the preschool room.
