922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:
- (j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of documentation present in the personnel file for an employee with a hire date of 01/12/12 revealed no documented evidence of an annual staff evaluation assessing the staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance. Exit interview with the child care center's site director revealed acknowledgement of deficient practice.

Employee Records Not In Compliance

320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of records for staff with hire dates of 07/15/16 and 01/12/12 revealed no documented evidence of a current statement from a health professional that the employees are free of active tuberculosis or a copy of negative tuberculin results. Exit interview with the child care center site director revealed acknowledgement of deficient practice.



340 - Training **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
 - (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of employee record for staff with a hire date of 08/31/15 revealed no documented evidence of Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training completed within their first year of employment. Further review revealed this staff failed to complete six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment. Additional review of record for staff with hire date of 03/03/06 revealed no documented evidence of completed fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during subsequent year of employment. Exit interview with the child care center director revealed acknowledgement of deficient practice.

- (c) Be cleaned and sanitized daily.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the "Boys" bathroom revealed a strong odor of urine was detected upon entrance to the restroom. Exit interview with the child care center site director revealed acknowledgement of deficient practice.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap:
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the "Boys" bathroom revealed a broken cold water sink handle. The location of the sink was the first sink on the right of the bathroom. Additional observation revealed yellow tape around the broken cold water sink handle. The director acknowledged the condition of the faucet cold water handle.

Further review of the document did not reveal if the immunization certificate was current or expired. Exit interview with the child care center director revealed acknowledgement of deficient practice.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the child care center's written documentation revealed the child care center failed to conduct quarterly earthquake and tornado drills for the months of the survey review period detailing the date, time and children who participated in the drill. Exit interview with the child care center director revealed acknowledgement of deficient practice.

1120 - Fire Drills Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 3. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (i) A written record of practiced fire drills conducted monthly detailing the date, time, and children who participated in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120, Section 3;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the child care center's written records revealed the child care failed to conduct monthly fire drills detailing the date, time and children who participated for the months of the survey review period. Exit interview with the child care center director revealed acknowledgement of deficient practice.
