General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. Two (2) uncovered electrical outlets and exposed wiring were observed in the church gym that the children go to each week. The staff person picked up the loose wires that were observed on the gym floor and tucked them inside a small electrical box in the wall during the visit; however, there was not a cover on the box to secure the wires. The staff person in charge stated that the gym is shared space with the church and community groups.

General: Based on review of documentation, staff hired on 05/06/19 did not have education documentation on file.

- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

## Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, staff hired on 02/12/18, 04/01/09 and 01/05/18 did not have documentation on file from a health care professional stating that the staff were free of active tuberculosis.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the following was found:

1. Staff hired on 04/01/09 had a pediatric abusive head trauma course on file dated 10/08/13. The course is to be retaken every five (5) years.

2. Staff hired on 01/05/18 had only nine (9) and one half cabinet approved training hours on file.

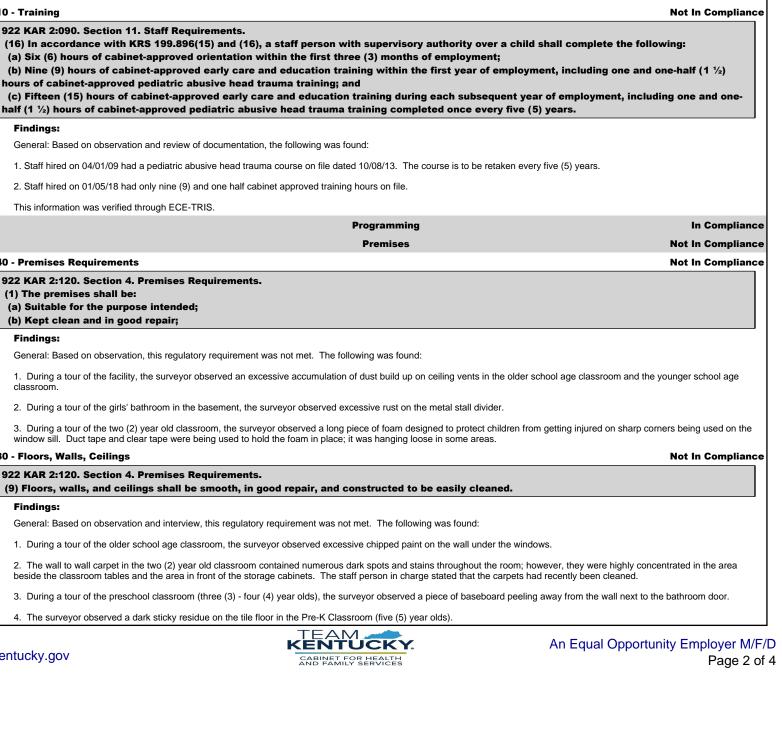

(6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be: (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:

1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;

2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;

3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:

a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;

b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;

c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and

d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or

4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;

(b) Kept in the original bottle; and

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

(c) Properly labeled.

(7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

1. During a tour of the Pre-K Classroom (five (5) year olds), the surveyor observed a large container that had spilt over in the storage area. Approximatley fifteen (15) - twenty (20) bottles of sunscreen were observed all over the floor in this area. There was no door separating the classroom area from the storage area; therefore, these bottles were accessible to the children and not stored properly.

2. During a tour of the infant classroom, the surveyor observed an unlocked medication box inside an unlocked cabinet above the sink. The surveyor opened the box and observed seven (7) bottles of medication (Walgreen Infants' Pain and Fever, prescription eye ointment, Little Remedies Fever and Pain Relief, and four (4) bottles of infants' gas relief drops), stored inside. Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. During a tour of the playground the surveyor observed approximatley five - eight (5-8) wooden landscape timbers used as a border around the fence line that were rotting and disintegrating. Several metal pegs used to secure the boards into the ground were exposed and were accessible to the children

### 755 - Protective Surface

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

1. The surveyor observed two (2) children playing on the swing set on the older playground during the visit. The swings have a concrete slab surface underneath them with black padded mats positioned on top of the concrete. Two (2) of the large black pads were missing; therefore, a portion of the concrete was exposed and there was no protective surface material underneath one (1) of the swings.

2. During a tour of the middle playground, the surveyor observed sparse mulch at the base of a large climber with a double blue slide. This type of surfacing does not provide adequate cushioning for the children during falls. The staff person in charge acknowledged that the mulch surface needed to be replentished throughout the playground area.

General: Based on observatio, and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. During a tour of the playground the surveyor observed a section of th to separate the middle playground from the older playground, that was in disrepair. Black tape was being used to secure the chain link fence to the metal po top. The staff person in charge stated that they were in the process of getting repairs made.

Findings:		
General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:		
1. During a tour of the playground the surveyor observed excessive chipped paint on two (2) wooden swing sets.		
2. The surveyor observed a broken plastic storage container positioned on the floor in the older school age classroom.		
3. The surveyor observed excessive ice built up around the freezer compartment inside the refrigerator in the infant classroom. The freezer section was not usable space.		
4. During a tour of the one (1) year old classroom, the surveyor observed that all of the cabinet doors on the wooden dramatic play kitchen set had been taped shut with clear tape. Furthermore, there were no accessories to go with this play structure; therefore, this does not meet the interests of the children.		
5. A green throw pillow in the preschool classroom contained dark spots and stains.		
6. The surveyor observed torn corners and seams on a red vinyl child size couch and chair in the preschool classroom.
