General: Based on Observation, at the time of the survey there was a sink of dirty dishes. Some of the plates had dried macaroni and cheese and along with other dried food. During an interview with the provider it was found that some of the dishes were left from supper the night before and some of the dishes were from breakfast that morning. There was also an accumulation of dried food on the wall behind the sink and stove.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the provider used a large blue and red trifold padded vinyl mat with an additional thin padded vinyl mat placed on top to change a diaper. The blue and red trifold mat had torn areas around the edges and corners of the mat. This does not allow for the mat to be adequately sanitized between each diaper change.

General: Based on Observation, there were several broken toys, empty water bottles and broken plastic cups under the steps of the deck. These items were accessible to the children. In addition there was an uncovered gas grill with the gas tank attached on the deck. Child sized chairs and toys were observed sitting on the deck where the grill was located.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a Graco Pack 'n Play Playard Sport was observed in the area used for child care. An interview with the provider found that she recently bought the playard used off of Amazon approximately a week and a half ago. The provider stated during interview that she bought the playard to put an infant and a toddler enrolled in to protect them against a child who bites. The provider stated that the children do not sleep in the playard and they are not placed in there at the same time. The provider was asked if there was documentation to verify compliance with CFR 1221. The provider stated that no information came with the playard. Therefore it could not be determined if the playard is in compliance with CFR 1221.
