- (1) A person who is a child care staff member prior to January 1, 2018, shall submit to and complete background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation no later than September 30, 2018.
- (2) A child care staff member hired on or after April 1, 2018, shall:
- (a) Have completed the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation and been found to have no disqualifying offense prior to becoming a child care staff member; or
- (b)1. Have submitted to the background checks required in accordance with this administrative regulation;
- 2. Not be left unsupervised with a child in care pending the completion of the background checks in accordance with this administrative regulation; and
- 3. Be dismissed or relocated from the residence if the person is found to have a disqualifying background check result.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and record review, the certified provider and her spouse did not have written evidence of completing the National background check. The KARES system was reviewed and the certified provider and her spouse were both cleared in the system, but the certified provider did not have any written evidence on site of the National background check being completed.

345 - Harmful Items Inaccessible Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 11. The General Requirements of the Family Child-Care Home Environment.

- (3) The areas of the home that are accessible to children in care shall be free from items harmful to children including the following items:
- (a) Cleaning supplies, poisons, paints, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives, scissors, and sharp objects;
- (c) Power tools, lawn mowers, hand tools, nails, and other equipment;
- (d) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, combustibles, and flammable liquids;
- (e) Plastic bags; and
- (f) Litter and rubbish.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a drawer in the kitchen contained knives and it was accessible to the children. The certified provider indicated in interview that the children eat in the kitchen area.

355 - Covered Outlets Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 11. The General Requirements of the Family Child-Care Home Environment.

(6) Electrical outlets not in use shall be covered.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the playroom with the fireplace contained two (2) uncovered electrical outlets.

390 - Condition of Home Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 11. The General Requirements of the Family Child-Care Home Environment.

- (21) A family child-care home shall:
- (a) Be clean;
- (b) Be uncluttered;
- (c) Be free of insects and rodents;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following items were unclean or in disrepair in the home:

- 1. The room containing the posted items for the parents had holes in the drywall near the thermostat.
- 2. The same room contained crayon marks on the wall below the parent bulletin board and near the climber with the slide.
- 3. In the playroom with the fireplace, there was a hole in the drywall next to the sofa.
- 4. The hall bathroom, used by the children, contained dust and cobwebs on the light fixture above the hand-washing sink.
- 5. The kitchen ceiling contained a brown stained area. The certified provider indicated that they had a roof leak and the stain was from water.

420 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 13. Toilet and Diapering Requirements.

- (2) A sink shall be;
- (a) Located near or in close proximity to toilets;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap and single use, disposable hand drying material;
- (e) Equipped with an easily cleanable, covered waste receptacle; and
- (f) Near or in close proximity to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the bathroom in the hallway used by the children did not contain any paper towels.

In addition, the room that displayed the posted items for the parents contained a child-sized table with a sticky brown substance on the surface. The sign-in and out clipboard was located on the table.
