General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. The certified provider did not have written evidence of current CPR or first aid training. The certified provider indicated in interview that her cards were expired.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The main playroom contained several cords attached to a power strip on the floor next to the TV. The cords were accessible to the children. The children in care ranged in age from 1.5 years-old to six-years-old.

- (21) A family child-care home shall:
- (a) Be clean;
- (b) Be uncluttered;
- (c) Be free of insects and rodents;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The sofa in the main playroom contained two holes with exposed foam. One of the holes was very large.
- 2. The wall next to the couch in the main playroom contained areas of chipped paint.
- 3. A hole in the drywall was observed next to the gate by the front door.
- 4. There were brown smudges and dirt on the inside of the front door and on the wall next to the door.
- 5. The room that contained the posted items for the parents contained a dusty vent on the wall.
- 6. The room that contained the posted items for the parents contained marker on the wall.
- 7. The kitchen contained a missing cabinet covering under the sink.
- 8. The kitchen contained a linoleum tile that was not attached properly to the floor in the corner.
- 9. The kitchen contained numerous crumbs, cereal, and a discarded bowl on the floor.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. An uncovered gas grill with a propane gas tank attached was observed on the deck. The grill was accessible to the children. This was previously cited during an inspection conducted on 1/23/2018 and an inspection conducted on 1/29/2020.

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The certified provider did not have any two inch thick waterproof mats or cots for the children to nap on. Three of the four children present were toddler or preschool age children that did not have adequate equipment for napping.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The certified provider and her assistant were not wearing a mask during the renewal survey. Both staff were interacting with the children during the renewal. The certified provider indicated that her assistant has a medical condition and cannot wear a mask. No documentation was on file indicating the assistant was exempt from wearing a mask.
