- (a) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR); and
- (b) First aid.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. At the time of the visit, it was found that the provider's CPR and first aid card had expired 12/2020. The provider stated that she knew it had expired, but she had not found a class to renew her certification.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The provider stated during interview that she did not have any T.B. documentation on file for her 18 year old daughter who lives in the home.

(a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. A review of the children's records found that one child had an immunization certificate that was no longer current as of 10/27/20, and a second child had an immunization certificate that was no longer current as of 4/1/20.

The certified family child-care home provider shall:

- (b) The planned program of activities;
- (c) Each statement of deficiency issued by the cabinet during the current certification period;
- (d) Each plan of correction submitted by the certified family child-care home to the cabinet during the current certification period; and
- (e) Daily schedule including any trips outside the family child-care home;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the planned program of activities posted did not contain a date; therefore, the surveyor was unable to determine if it was current.

922 KAR 2:100 - Section 16. Animals.

- (1) An animal shall not be allowed in the presence of a child in care:
- (a) Unless:
- 1. The animal is under the supervision and control of an adult;
- 2. Written parental consent has been obtained; and
- 3. The animal is certified as vaccinated against rabies; or
- (b) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section.
- (2) A parent shall be notified in writing if a child has been bitten or scratched by an animal.
- (3) An animal that is considered undomesticated, wild, or exotic shall not be allowed at a certified family child-care home unless the animal is:
- (a) A part of a planned program activity led by an animal specialist affiliated with a zoo or nature conservatory; and
- (b) In accordance with 301 KAR 2:081 and 301 KAR 2:082.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the rabies vaccination certificate for the dog in the home (Boxer) contained a 6/21/20 expiration date; therefore, it was no longer current. The provider stated that she had a current certificate; however, was not able to locate it during the visit.

922 KAR 2:410E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), certified family child care homes must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

850 - Emergency Regulation

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. The provider had a criminal records check (CRC) on file for her 18 year old daughter that lives in the home; however, she did not have evidence or results of a child abuse/neglect check (CAN) for this person. The provider stated that a CAN check was processed; however, she was not able to locate it during the inspection.
