Surveyor observed the preschool children in the music room, located in the school new building, on 09/07/18. Interview with the director revealed the children had used the music room since the first day of school on 08/15/18.

There was a large deep hole, which measured approximately 11 inches deep, at the fence, in the playground. Several black plastic playground borders were not connected to each other and were scattered throughout the playground.
