### Findings:

General: Based on Observation and interview, staff hired 8/27/08, supervised nineteen (19), two-year-old childen when surveyor arrived in the two-year-olds' room. Interview determined she supervised these children for five (5) minutes. The staff responsible for nine (9) of the children went to the parking lot to move her vehicle. Also, two (2) staff hired 6/15/04 and 4/19/18, supervised thirteen (13) toddler children in the toddlers' room from 8:30 am to 9:30 am.

General: Based on Observation, a two-year-old child did not wash his hands after he was diapered.

General: Based on Observation, staff wore gloves but did not wash hands before she diapered a child in the two-year-olds' room.

- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

General: Based on Observation, a child enrolled 7/23/18, enrollment information did not include the name of the child's physician. Two (2) children each enrolled on 1/8/18 and 5/10/18, had enrollment information that did not include the name of the preferred hospital.
