## Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. During a tour of the outdoor play area, the surveyor observed a ground aerator with ten metal rotating spikes. This piece of equipment was positioned beside the storage building and was accessible to the children's play area. The provider stated that the children have not been playing in the outdoor play area because they have been working on remodeling projects.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

1. The wire fence across the back of the children's play area was found in disrepair. Several wires were broken along the bottom portion of the fence and protruding out in different directions, which created sharp points/edges.

- 2. A long metal rod/stick was observed lying in an open fire pit in front of the children's play structure.
- 3. Several wooden planks with protruding nails were observed stacked up on the sidewalk next to the back door.

The provider stated that the children have not been playing in the outdoor play area because they have been working on remodeling projects.

The provider stated that she was not aware of this regulatory requirement.

The provider stated that she was not aware of this regulatory requirement.
