### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that 1) an outdoor play area being used by the preschool age children had not been approved by the Division of Regulated Child Care (DRCC); 2) the facility's preschool program was found to begin at 7:50 a.m. and end at 12:30 p.m. when the extended day program began. The hours on file for the facility are 12:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. This change in hours was not reported to the DRCC; 3) the classroom for the four-year-old children was found to be located in a room that had not been approved by the DRCC.

# Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that a plunger in the bathroom located in the Two Year Old classroom was accessible to the children. In addition, it was found that the children's coats in the Pre-K 3 classroom were overlapping while hanging on the wall hooks.



275 - Caregiver Alone Not In Compliance

## 922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:
- (n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in Section 3(1)(e)6 of this administrative regulation;

#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that two (2) employees hired on 8-16-16 were working together in a Two Year Old classroom. One (1) of these employees did not have a completed criminal records check on file. Neither of these employees had a completed central registry check on file.

- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that 1) the files for two (2) employees hired on 8-16-16 did not contain evidence of submission for or the results of completed central registry checks; 2) the file for an employee hired on 8-16-16 did not contain evidence of submission for or the results of a central registry check or a criminal records check. Two (2) of these employees were observed to be working together in a classroom.

320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

# 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that 1) the file for an employee hired on 4-18-14 contained the results of a TB skin test that was dated 4-24-14. This date is not within the two (2) year timeframe required by the regulation; 2) the files for employees hired on 8-16-16 and 2-15-17 did not contain evidence of a TB skin test or screening being completed.

340 - Training Not In Compliance

# 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
  - (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

# Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that 1) the file and ECE-TRIS record for an employee hired on 9-1-08 contained evidence of only 7.5 cabinet-approved hours of training being completed during the last completed training year; 2) the file and ECE-TRIS record for an employee hired on 4-18-14 did not contain evidence of Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma being completed. Her records also did not contain evidence of any training being completed during the last completed training year; 3) the file and ECE-TRIS record for an employee hired on 8-1-02 contained evidence of only 7.5 hours of training being completed during the last completed training year; 4) the files and ECE-TRIS records for two (2) employees hired on 1-4-16 contained evidence of only 1.5 hours of additional training being completed during their first year of employment; 5) the file and ECE-TRIS records for an employee hired on 8-16-16 did not contain evidence of the six-hour cabinet-approved orientation training being completed.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that one (1) child's file out of ten (10) children's files reviewed contained an immunization certificate that expired on 9-22-16

### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the information for two (2) siblings was recorded on the same form. It was also found that two (2) children's files out of ten (10) children's files reviewed did not contain information regarding the parent's preferred hospital.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that a daily schedule was not posted in the Pre-K 3 classroom.

- (h) Post a schedule of daily activities, to include dates and times of activities to be conducted with the children in each classroom;

General: Based on Observation, it was found that a schedule of daily activities was not posted in the Two Year Old classroom or the Pre-K 3 classroom.

(9) The proper methods of diapering and hand-washing shall be posted at each diaper changing area.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the diapering and handwashing procedures were not posted at the diaper changing station located in the Two Year Old classroom.
