A review of documentation failed to reveal a current copy of 922 KAR 2:120, 922 KAR 2:280, and 922 KAR 2:090. The regulations presented for review were dated 06/30/15 and 09/18/14.</p>

No loose bedding, such as a bumper or a blanket; and 4. No toys or other items except the infant’s pacifier;</p> <p>Findings: General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Based on observation in the Infant room, two infants were sleeping with paci clips attached to clothing while in the crib. One of the paci’s had a small stuffed animal attached to the clip.</p>

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:**
 - (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;**
 - (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and**
 - (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation on the playground revealed a brown plastic chest containing a gallon jug of Ortho Insect Killer, a large jug of Round-Up weed killer, and a container of Miracle Gro plant food, all with the warnings of Keep Out of the Reach of Children. The chest failed to be locked and was accessible to the children.

650 - Toilet

- (4) Each toilet shall:**
 - (a) Be kept in clean condition;**
 - (b) Be kept in good repair;**
 - (c) Be in a lighted room; and**
 - (d) Have ventilation to outside air.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation in the Older 2's class bathroom and the Pooh's Corner bathroom failed to reveal ventilation to outside air.

- (20) An outdoor play area shall be:**
 - (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;**
 - (e) Well drained;**
 - (f) Well maintained;**
 - (g) In good repair; and**
 - (h) Visible to staff at all times.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation on the playground revealed splintered wood on a front post of the pavillion. Also observed was a tree stump protruding out of the ground in the front of the pavillion.

- (24) Supports for climbing apparatus and large equipment shall be securely fastened to the ground.**
- (25) Crawl spaces, such as tunnels, shall be short and wide enough to permit access by adults.**
- (26) A sandbox shall be:**
 - (a) Constructed to allow for drainage;**
 - (b) Covered when not in use;**
 - (c) Kept clean; and**
 - (d) Checked for vermin prior to use.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation on the playground, revealed a blue slide which was not secured to the ground.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:**
 - (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;**
 - (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;**
 - (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and**
 - (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation revealed multiple ceiling sprinklers containing an excessive amount of gray dust covering the apparatus, throughout the center.

(b) A written record for each child:

- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;**
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and**
- 3. To contain:**

a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;

b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:

(i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;

(ii) Family physician; and

(iii) Preferred hospital;

c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;

d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:

(i) Allergies;

(ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and

(iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;

e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;

f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. A review of ten (10) children's files failed to reveal the name of each person designated in writing to pick-up the child for a child enrolled on 10/15/18.
