General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the staff in charge did not present verification that the staff members with the hire dates of 06/09/2013, 06/14/2017, and 11/29/2000 had updated their Pediatric Head Trauma training after five (5) years. Continued review revealed the staff members with the hire dates of 08/10/2020 and 08/24/2020 did not complete new orientation training within the first ninety (90) days of employment. Review of documentation in the ECE-TRIS training system revealed the staff members listed above had not met the requirement.

There was an area on the back wall located in the gross motor room that contained flaking paint. There was a small portion of the rubber wall trim that was missing, with exposed dried glue.
