General: Based on observation, in the bathroom there was a drawer in the cabinet where the sink is located that contained an electric razor. There was not a lock or child safety latch on the drawer to assure the razor is inaccessible to the children.

- (c) Power tools, lawn mowers, hand tools, nails, and other equipment;
- (d) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, combustibles, and flammable liquids;
- (e) Plastic bags; and
- (f) Litter and rubbish.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a bottle of Clorox cleaning solution and various other cleaners, hair products and lotions were observed in a cabinet under the sink in the bathroom. There was not a child safety latch or other locking mechanism to assure the items were inaccessible to the children. The labels on the containers contained a warning to keep out of the reach of children.

General: Based on observation, there was a cabinet in the bathroom located on a wall by a storage closet. The cabinet contained various medications that belonged to the staff person in charge. There was not a lock on the cabinet. A child safety gate was located at the entrance to the hallway where the bathroom is located. The gate was open at the time of the survey.
