(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child will be:

- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who:
  - a. Ensures the child is within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain adequate supervision in accordance with regulatory requirements. At approximately 10:20 a.m., a staff member exited the infant classroom, leaving five (5) infants alone in the classroom, out of the scope of vision. The staff retrieved an item from a bag hanging on a wall hook in the school-age classroom. The staff then re-entered the room in less than a minute.

At 11:40 a.m., a staff was returning her class from a restroom break with six (6) children. The staff entered the older two-year-old classroom with five (5) children, while one (1) child remained outside the classroom near the cubicles. Within a minute, the director walked around the corner and observed the two-year-old child alone. The director then escorted the child into the classroom.

- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

## Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request the child care director did not present verification that the records of the employees with the hire dates of 02/14/2011 and 10/08/2012 contained a current copy of a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis, or a copy of negative tuberculin results.

#### 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
  - (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request the child care director did not present verification that the staff members with the hire dates of 10/08/2012, 07/30/2014 and 01/19/2015 had met the requirement of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during the last year of employment. Review of documentation in the ECE-TRIS training system revealed the staff members listed above had not met the requirements.

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Five (5) of the nine (9) classrooms' walls within the center were not maintained as evidenced by numerous dark smudges and black marks, along with chipped paint.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation and documentation review, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding first aid and or medication. Located in the infant classroom (#6) on the windowsill, there was a 14-ounce jar of "Aquaphor" diaper cream. Review of the diaper cream container revealed the cream was not labeled for individual use, nor secured. Continued observation revealed there were several tubes of Oral-Gel that was not labeled for individual use.

- 3. As part of the cooking process; or
- 4. By another method in accordance with the Department of Public Health's food safety standards and permits, established in KRS Chapter

# Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. The freezer unit located in the kitchen had a reading of twenty (20) degrees Fahrenheit and did not meet the regulatory requirements of zero degrees Fahrenheit or below.
