1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:

a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or

b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, this regulatory requirement was not met. All of the children and staff were in the gym, while the surveyor was reviewing records in the cafeteria. At approximately 3:55PM, two school age children entered the cafeteria from a back hallway. The two children (one male and one female) walked across the entire length of the cafeteria to get a drink at a water fountain, waved at a couple of parents standing outside at an exterior door, and then exited the cafeteria doors that lead out into the main hallway and the gym. The male child told the surveyor that they were putting balls away in the storage closet. As the two children were exiting the cafeteria doors to return to the gym, the surveyor heard the staff person in charge ask the two children where they had been and instructed them to return to the gym. These two children were not adequately supervised while they were in the cafeteria because the water fountain is not within scope of vision or range of voice from the gym. It is important to note that the surveyor toured the storage area after the children returned the balls and observed a hand saw positioned on top of a cart with wheels in the same room.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The surveyor observed three staff caring for a group of 33 school age children in the gym from 3:35PM-4:00PM. The youngest child in the group was six years old, making the maximum group size 30. The facility exceeded the group size by three children.

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each

subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

# (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and the Training Records Information System (TRIS), two staff (hire dates: 9/9/16 and 8/20/21) did not complete the required Orientation training. These staff have been employed for more than three months. It is important to note that the staff person with a 9/9/16 hire date switched from an Ohio location to a Kentucky location in 2021; therefore, was not required to complete this training previously.

The staff person in charge stated that they are supposed to be getting more baskets from another location soon.

1. One child (enrollment date: 7/26/21) did not have an immunization certificate on file.
