General: Based on observation, a large bottle of hand sanitizer was labeled "Keep out of reach of children," and was stored accessible to the preschool children on a counter at the doorway in room 15-B. A large value size container of Clorox Bleach wipes were labeled "Keep out of reach of children," and was stored accessible to the preschool children on a counter in room 16-B.

- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

General: Based on observation, six (6) preschool children did not wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water after they ate morning snack in room 15-B.
