Findings:

General: Based on Observation and Interview, accordance with regulations. Observation of the Pre-K Room on 10/19/15 revealed the center failed to ensure that all children were visible to staff members during naptime. Observation of the Pre-K Room from approximately 2:41pm-2:42pm revealed two (2) children lying on mats behind shelves that were not visible to the staff members in the room. During interview, director acknowledged the deficiency.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and Interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of incident report revealed on 10/5/15 a three-year-old fell on the playground, hit his mouth against a fence, and knocked out his front tooth. Interviews with director, staff, and parent were consistent with the incident report. Interview with director revealed she was the only staff member present and on duty at the time of incident who was currently certified to administer first aid and CPR. Review of documentation revealed the director's American Heart Association (AHA) First Aid/CPR card was the only card presented for review at the time of survey. Review of documentation revealed the "issue date" and "recommended renewal date" were not clearly written on the director's AHA First Aid/CPR card presented for review at the time of survey; therefore, surveyor requested verification of the card. Interview with representative from the AHA revealed the card is deemed invalid.
