Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain adequate supervision in accordance with regulations. At 11:05 am, a four-year-old child walked down the short hallway and entered the Pre-K Room without his class, while the staff member supervising him was still in the hallway guiding the other children to the classroom. Once the four-year-old child entered the classroom, he was not visible to the staff member in the hallway for a few seconds until the staff member entered the classroom.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. In the Pre-K Room, one (1) staff member was the sole caregiver of fifteen (15) children ages three-years-old to ten-years-old from 10:07am-10:11am.

## Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. For a few minutes in the Pre-K Room, at least (3) different children, ages four-years-old and older, were repeatedly and simultaneously climbing on chairs, tables, and shelves, then jumping off this equipment on to the floor as the sole caregiver in the room worked to get these children under control while trying to manage the other eleven (11) children in the room.

### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, Review of Documentation, and Interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Observation of the Ones Room revealed a staff member hired 3/22/17 was the sole caregiver of four (4) one-year-olds from 10:06am – 10:33am. Review of staff files revealed the staff member hired 3/22/17 listed an Indiana address on her Child Abuse & Neglect Check (CAN) signed 3/13/17. An Indiana Criminal Records Check (CRC) was not presented for review at the time of survey for the staff member hired 3/22/17. The director revealed an Indiana CRC had not been completed for this staff member.

(14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and Interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files and ECE-TRIS report revealed documentation of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training was not presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member hired 1/6/14. The director revealed this documentation was not available for review at the time of survey. Documentation of pediatric abusive head trauma training (PAHT) was not presented for review at the time of survey for two (2) staff members hired 1/6/14 and 11/16/15. The director revealed the staff member hired 11/16/15 has not completed the PAHT, and documentation was not available for review at the time of survey for the staff member hired 1/6/14.

## Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. In the Pre-K Room, a staff member's purse was on a low shelf in an unlocked cabinet, accessible to children in care. In the Two-Year-Old Room, a staff member's purse was hanging from a hook attached to a shelf, in reach of children in care. The kitchen is located at the front of the center, near the bathrooms used by children. In the kitchen, there was bleach stored on a low shelf and bleach and other cleaning supplies stored in an unlocked cabinet underneath the sink. The kitchen door was wide open, thereby making these items accessible to children in care.

# Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. In the boys' and girls' bathrooms, there was a dust buildup in the ceiling vents. In the boy's bathroom, there were spots of a black substance in the cabinet underneath the sink. In the girls' bathroom, there were black specks of dirt in the cabinet underneath the sink. In the pre-K Room, the sink was lightly soiled and the drain was clogged, causing the water to fill up in the sink and then drain slowly.
