Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the employee file for a staff member with a hire date of 6/9/2021 did not contain verification that a check of the state's sex offender registry or repository, or a check of the state-based child abuse and neglect registry database for the state of North Carolina had been conducted. The staff member in charge acknowledged that an out of state background check had not been conducted.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the most recent Fire Marshal inspection documentation provided by the licensee was dated 6/2/2019. The licensee failed to provide verification that a new inspection was requested. The staff member in charge acknowledged that a new inspection had not been requested.

(4)(a) Written notification of the following shall be:

- 1. Made to the cabinet, in writing, to allow for approval before implementation:
- a. Change of ownership;
- b. Change of location;
- c. Increase in capacity;

- e. Change of services in the following categories:
- (i) Infant;
- (ii) Toddler;
- (iii) Preschool-age;
- (iv) School-age;

Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the licensee failed to report a change in hours of operation. Per review of Division of Regulated Child Care records, the center's hours of operation are 5:00 am- 6:00 pm Monday through Friday. Review of the center's staff schedule and interview with the staff member in charge revealed the center's hours of operation are currently 7:30 am-6:00 pm Monday through Friday.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
- 1. High school diploma:
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the employee files for staff members with hire dates of 8/4/2020 and 3/13/2021 did not contain a high school diploma, GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or Commonwealth Child Care Credential. Interview with the staff member in charge revealed that the documentation for the aforementioned staff members was not available at the time of the survey.

395 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the employee file for a staff member with a hire date of 6/28/2021 did not contain a current statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or a copy of negative tuberculin results. The staff member in charge acknowledged that the documentation was not available at the time of the survey.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the employee files for staff members with hire dates of 2/8/2021 and 3/13/2021 did not contain verification that the staff members received six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment. Continued review revealed the employee file for the aforementioned staff member with a hire date of 2/8/2021 did not contain verification that the staff member had completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training within the past five (5) years. The staff member in charge acknowledged this deficiency. Review of ECE-TRIS also failed to verify completion of the aforementioned trainings.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there were two bottles of bleach in an unlocked cabinet located below the sink in the Two Year Old Room.

525 - Items Accessible Only During Activity

- (8) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care unless under direct supervision and part of planned program of instruction:
- (a) Knives and sharp objects;
- (b) Litter and rubbish;

Findings

General: Based on observation, there were plastic garbage bags in an unlocked drawer located in the boys bathroom; therefore, the plastic bags were accessable to children.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a ceiling tile in the boys bathroom contained a circular, brown spot, indicative of water damage.

650 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the boys' bathroom was not ventilated to outside air.

General: Based on observation, there were cracks and a hole in the fluorescent light cover located in the hallway.

- (4) A cold-storage facility used for storage of perishable food in a nonfrozen state shall:
- (a) Have an indicating thermometer or other appropriate temperature measuring device;
- (b) Be in a safe environment for preservation; and
- (c) Be forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was no thermometer or other appropriate temperature measuring device present in the refrigerator located in the kitchen; therefore, the temperature of the refrigerator could not be determined.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (16) A weekly menu shall be:
- (a) Prepared;
- (b) Dated;
- (c) Posted in advance in a conspicuous place;
- (d) Kept on file for thirty (30) days; and
- (e) Amended in writing with any substitutions on the day the meal is served.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the posted weekly menu was not current.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the immunization certificates for children enrolled 1/20/2020 and 11/20/2020 were expired.

1140 - Enrollment Information Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the enrollment file for a child enrolled on 1/20/2020 did not list a family physician.
