General: Based on observation, a preschool-age child was allowed to go to the restroom alone while the caregiver remained in room 205. The restroom was down the hallway, which was approximately sixteen (16) feet away from room 205. Therefore, child was not in the caregiver's scope of vision and range of voice.

(c) Properly labeled.

General: Based on observation, a tube of Aquaphor Healing Diaper Ointment was not labeled in a medication box in room 106. A tube of Aquaphor Healing Diaper Ointment and a tube of Medline Remedy Essentials Barrier Skin Protectant Ointment were in a blue bin on a shelf, which was accessible to the children in room 103. The blue bin was twenty-six (26) inches from the floor.
