(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child shall be:

- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:
- a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, three (3) preschool children exited the three-year-olds' classroom alone and walked across the hallway to the restroom on 3/18/22. The children's caregiver was observed in the three-year-olds' classroom attending to other children. The three (3) children were not within the caregiver's scope of vision when they went to the restroom; therefore the caregiver did not provide supervision.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a preschool-age child's mouth was up to a faucet while he drank water from a handwashing sink in the restroom across from the three-year-olds' room on 3/18/22.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 3/14/05, had TB documentation on file that was dated 10/12/19. A caregiver hired on 10/11/16, had TB documentation on file that was dated 10/18/19.

435 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 11/4/20, did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation training and one and one half (1 1/2) hours of Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma Training. In addition, the caregiver completed six (6) hours of training during the first year of employment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, six (6) uncovered cups of milk and six (6) uncovered plates of pretzels and cheese were on table in the school age room. The caregivers and children were not present in the room and had not returned to the school age room after approximately ten (10) minutes of observation.

- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled on 1/1/21, had an immunization certificate on file that was valid until 10/29/21. A child enrolled on 8/23/21, had an immunization certificate on file that was valid until 1/3/22.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) children enrolled on 8/30/21 and 8/23/21, did not have a preferred hospital documented in the enrollment information. A child enrolled on 8/1/20, did not have a preferred hospital, the name and phone number of a physician, and authorization by a parent for the center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence in the enrollment information.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the center had twenty-six (26) documented biting incidents from September 2021 to March 2022. Interview determined a child was placed in timeout each time after he/she bit another child. Further interview determined the center did not have a discipline policy in writing.
