(j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and Interview, the director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Review of staff files revealed an annual written performance evaluation was not presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member hired 12/1/12. Interview with director revealed an evaluation had not been completed for the staff member.

Employee Records 340 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and Interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files and ECE-TRIS report revealed documentation of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training was not presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member hired 12/1/12. Interview with director revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

345 - Driver Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Transportation.

- (18) A driver of a vehicle transporting a child for a center shall:
- (a) Be at least twenty-one (21) years old;
- (b) Complete:
- 1. The background checks as described in 922 KAR 2:110; and
- 2. An annual check of the:
- a. Kentucky driver history records in accordance with KRS 186.018; or
- b. Driver history records through the state transportation agency that issued the driver's license;
- (c) Hold a current driver's license which has not been suspended or revoked during the last five (5) years; and
- (d) Not caused an accident which resulted in the death of a person.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation and Interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files revealed documentation of current certification by a cabinet approved training agency in Infant and Child Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Infant and Child First Aid as required for a center licensed for infant, toddler, and preschool children was no longer valid as it had expired on 3/30/17 for the driver, hired 1/20/05. Interview with director revealed this documentation was not available for review at the time of survey.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of School Age classroom revealed several areas where the paint was chipping and peeling from the walls.

- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals;

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulations. Observation of the Infant Room revealed an infant's hands were not washed after a diaper change.

- (a) Maintain personal cleanliness;
- (b) Conform to hygienic practices while on duty; and
- (c) Wash their hands with liquid soap and running water:
- 1. Upon arrival at the center;
- 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;
- 3. Before and after diapering each child;
- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;
- 5. After handling animals;
- 6. After caring for a sick child;
- 7. Before and after feeding a child or eating;
- 8. Before dispensing medication; and
- 9. If possible, before administering first aid.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulations. Observation of the Infant Room revealed a staff member changed an infant's diaper, then touched other children and several items in the classroom, but did not wash her hands with liquid soap and running water after the diaper change.

- (12) Staff shall disinfect the diapering surface after each child is diapered.
- (13) If staff wear disposable gloves, the gloves shall be changed and disposed after each child is diapered.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the child care center failed to maintain hygienic practices in accordance with regulations. Observation of the Infant Room revealed a staff member failed to sanitize the diapering surface after changing a child's diaper
