320 - Operation instruction/Regulation copy

922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

- (2) Child-care center staff shall be:
- (a) Instructed by the child-care center's director regarding requirements for operation; and
- (b) Provided with a copy of this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280.

Findinas

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request a current copy of regulations was not presented for review. Review of the presented regulations revealed they were dated for 2008.

340 - Staff Meeting Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (i) Conduct, manage, and document in writing recurring staff meetings;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Upon request documentation of staff meetings was not presented for review.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements.

- 1) Review of presented staff files revealed a staff member with the hire date 1/20/05 did not complete fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training. Review of the ECE TRIS report did not verify that the training hours had been completed. Interview with the director revealed she was not able to verify the training hours were completed.
- 2) Upon request documentation was not presented to verify that two (2) staff members with the hire dates 1/20/05 and 12/1/12 had completed pediatric abusive head trauma training within the last five (5) years.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the bathroom on the left in the hallway revealed a six (6) inch crack in the wall behind the toilet.

650 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the bathroom on the left in the hallway revealed there was not ventilation to outside air.

- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:

- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements.

- 1) Observation of the large outdoor playground revealed a Step 2 climbing apparatus that had small foam mats under it; therefore, it did not have protective surfacing.
- 2) Observation of the small outdoor playground revealed a yellow slide and green slide that were on turf grass.

Equipment

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

Not In Compliance

(6) Cots, equipment, and furnishings used for sleeping and napping shall be spaced twelve (12) inches apart to allow free and safe movement by a person.

Findings:

800 - Twelve Inch Spacing

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the four-and-five-year-old room revealed the mats were not spaced twelve (12) inches apart with sleeping children on them at rest time.



815 - Toys/Furniture Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (1) All toys and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the infant room revealed a soiled rectangular rug.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements.

- 1) Observation of the Windstar van revealed the back seat on the driver side was torn, exposing the inside material.
- 2) Observation of the large outdoor playground revealed a wooden climbing apparatus with wood that is splintered and sharp in areas.
- 3) Continued observation of the wooden climbing apparatus revealed screws that are protruding up out of the wood.

Transportation

860 - Transportation Notification/Full Coverage Insurance

- (3) Prior to transporting a child, a center providing transportation services of a child shall notify the cabinet or its designee in writing of the:
- (d) Full insurance coverage for each vehicle;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding transportation. Review of the insurance documentation presented for the 2001 Windstar and 2006 Odyssey revealed neither vehicle was listed as having full coverage insurance. Continued review of the insurance documents for both aforementioned vehicles revealed it was for personal insurance and not commercial insurance.

880 - Vehicle Equipment Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Transportation.

- (4) A vehicle used to transport children shall be equipped with:
- (a) A fire extinguisher;
- (b) First aid supplies as established in Section 7 of this administrative regulation;
- (c) Emergency reflective triangles; and
- (d) A device to cut the restraint system, if necessary.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding transportation.

- 1) Observation of the Windstar van revealed the first aid supplies did not include liquid soap, and a CPR mouthpiece.
- 2) Observation of the Odyssey van revealed the first aid supplies did not include liquid soap, and a working flashlight.

910 - Car Seats Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Transportation.

(7) The appropriate car safety seat meeting federal and state motor vehicle safety standards in 49 C.F.R. 571.213 and KRS 189.125 shall be used for each child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding transportation. Observation of the Windstar van revealed a booster seat with the expiration date of 10/15/16. Interview with the director revealed children have been transported in the van. Continued interview revealed she was not aware that booster seats have an expiration date.

- (4) A cold-storage facility used for storage of perishable food in a nonfrozen state shall:
- (a) Have an indicating thermometer or other appropriate temperature measuring device;
- (b) Be in a safe environment for preservation; and
- (c) Be forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

1025 - Refrigerator

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the refrigerator in the infant room revealed the thermometer read forty-eight (48) degrees Fahrenheit.

1040 - Kitchen Equipment Clean and Sanitary

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.

- (7) The following shall be clean and sanitary:
- (a) Eating and drinking utensils;
- (b) Kitchenware;
- (c) Food contact surfaces of equipment;
- (d) Food storage utensils;
- (e) Food storage containers;
- (f) Cooking surfaces of equipment; and
- (g) Nonfood contact surfaces of equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the two-and-three-year-old room and the four-and-five-year-old room revealed the tables used at lunch time were not sanitized before lunch was served to the children.

1090 - Food Storage Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (8) Food shall be stored on:
- (a) Clean racks;
- (b) Clean shelves:
- (c) Other clean surfaces; or
- (d) If maintained in a sanitary condition, in nonabsorbent labeled containers a minimum of (6) six inches off the floor.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the kitchen revealed a bag of rice and beans located on a board on the floor; therefore, the food was not stored a minimum of six (6) inches off the floor.

Children's Records Not In Compliance

1140 - Enrollment Information

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of ten (10) children's files revealed one (1) file did not contain the information for the parents' preferred hospital and the contact information for the family physician.



Written Documentation

1155 - Policies and Procedures Not In Compliance

- 922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.
- (4) Program policies and procedures shall:
- (a) Be in writing; and
- (b) Include:
- 1. Staff policies;
- 2. Job descriptions;
- 3. An organization chart;
- 4. Chain of command; and
- 5. Other procedures necessary to ensure implementation of:
- a. KRS 199.898, Rights for children in child-care programs and their parents, custodians, or guardians posting and distribution requirements;
- b. 922 KAR 2:120, Child-care center health and safety standards;
- c. 922 KAR 2:280, Background checks for child care staff members, reporting requirements, and appeals; and
- d. This administrative regulation.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented staff policies and procedures revealed they were for a different child care center.

1185 - Confidentiality/Maintenance/Access

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 9. Records.

- (2) A child-care center shall:
- (a) Maintain the confidentiality of a child's record and information concerning a child or the child's parent;
- (b) Maintain all records for five (5) years; and
- (c) Provide the cabinet access and information in the completion of the investigation pursuant to KRS 620.030(4) and (5).

Findings

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain written documentation in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of documentation in the two-and-three-year-old room revealed a child's allergy information was posted where other parents or guardians may view the child's information, therefore resulting in a breach of confidentiality. Interview with the director revealed there was not written permission for the child care center to post children's allergies in the classrooms.
