<b>922 KAR 2:090. Section 12. Reports.</b> <b>(1) The following shall be reported to the cabinet or designee and other agencies specified in this section within twenty-four (24) hours from the time of discovery:</b> <b>(a) Communicable disease, which shall also be reported to the local health department pursuant to KRS 214.010;</b> <b>(b) An accident or injury to a child that requires medical care initiated by the child-care center or the child's parent;</b> <b>(c) An incident that results in legal action by or against the child-care center that:</b> <b>1. Affects a child or staff person; or</b> <b>2. Includes the center's discontinuation or disqualification from a governmental assistance program due to fraud, abuse, or criminal conviction related to that program;</b> <b>(d) An incident involving fire or other emergency, including a vehicular accident when the center is transporting a child receiving child care services;</b> <b>(e) A report of child abuse or neglect that:</b> <b>1. Has been accepted by the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 1:330; and</b> <b>2. Names a director, employee, volunteer, or person with supervisory or disciplinary control over, or having unsupervised contact with a child in care as the alleged perpetrator; or</b> <b>(f) An individual specified in Section 6(4) of this administrative regulation meeting a disqualifying criterion or background check result pursuant to 922 KAR 2:280.</b>	
<b>Findings:</b> Based on review of written documentation and interviews, the child care center did not report a communicable disease, COVID-19, to the Cabinet within twenty-four (24) hours of discovery. Review of written documentation, an email dated 12/09/2020, revealed the director reported a positive case of COVID-19 for a child in care. Further review revealed there was insufficient identifying information within the report. Additional information was requested and the child care center responded on 12/10/2020. Interview with the director revealed the child care center first discovered COVID-19 for the staff person and the child on 12/06/2020. Although the center sent an email on 12/09/2020, the email did not identify the specific child care center; therefore, the center did not report the disease until four (4) days after discovery, 12/10/2020.
