(1) To initiate the process for obtaining background checks on a prospective child care staff member, the child care provider shall:

(a) Request that the prospective child care staff member provide a copy of his or her driver's license or other government-issued photo

identification and verify that the photograph clearly matches the prospective child care staff member;

(b) Request that the prospective child care staff member complete and sign the:

1. DCC-500, Applicant Child Care Staff Member Waiver Agreement and Statement; and

2. DCC-501, Disclosures to Be Provided to and Signed by the Applicant Child Care Staff Member; and

(c) Log on to the NBCP portal and enter the prospective child care staff member's demographic information for a check of the:

1. Child abuse and neglect central registry pursuant to 922 KAR 1:470;

2. National Crime Information Center's National Sex Offender Registry in accordance with 34 U.S.C. 20921; and

3. Sex Offender Registry established in accordance with KRS 17.500 through 17.580.

Findings:

225 9 General: Based on review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A review of staff files during the inspection found that three staff members (hire dates: 3/22/21, 4/14/21, and 5/10/21) had a completed criminal records check (CRC) and a completed child abuse/neglect check (CAN) on file; however, the facility has yet to initiate the process for obtaining a background check for these staff members in the Kentucky National Background Check Service (KARES). The staff in charge stated that she misunderstood the email from the Division of Child Care (DCC) about the grace period for completing the KARES check in addition to CAN and CRC. The staff in charge explained that new staff have completed the KARES check, but those three staff members with the CRC and CAN did not, as she thought that was all she needed to do.

The cord was close to the crib, therefore a child who was in it could easily grab the cord. The sound device was not secured as it was placed behind the pipe on the wall next to the crib.

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

(17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a staff member (hire date: 8/10/2020) did not have evidence of completing 15 hours of annual early care and education training. A review of ECE-TRIS records supports the information found during the survey.
