Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a caregiver was alone while she supervised fourteen (14), one-year-old children. A second caregiver entered from the outside. During interview, the first caregiver stated she supervised the children alone for five (5) minutes, while the second caregiver went to the restroom. During interview, the second caregiver stated she went to take the trash outside. Minimum staff/child ratios and group size was not maintained.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 05/30/19, completed orientation training on 09/12/19; therefore, she did not complete the training within the first three (3) months of employment. A caregiver hired 04/01/17, did not complete one and one-half (1 1/2) hour of the required pediatric abusive head trauma training. A caregiver hired 01/15/04, completed five (5) hours of annual training. A caregiver hired 01/01/90, completed 13.5 hours of annual training. A caregiver hired 06/25/18, and a caregiver hired 06/22/18, each completed 6.5 hours of training within their first year of employment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the children watched a movie on the television while the ate breakfast in the three-year-old room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) infant children wore bibs around their necks while they slept in the cribs. An infant child had a bib around his neck with a pacifier fabric clip attached, while he slept in the crib.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a caregiver's thirty-two ounce drink set on a child's table and a large metal drinking cup labeled with the caregiver's name set on a shelf in the three-year-old room. These items were accessible to the three-year-old children.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a large area of ceiling plaster, approximately the size of a basketball and a smaller section of ceiling plaster, approximately the size of a softball, was peeled away from the ceiling in the preschool room.

General: Based on observation, a preschool child did not wash his hands when he arrived.

660 - Staff Hygiene/Handwashing

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the infant caregiver wore gloves but did not wash her hands before she diapered a child.

General: Based on observation, a diaper changing mat in the two-year-old room and a diaper changing mat in the toddler room were torn.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, three (3) large ceiling lights in the preschool room; two-year-old room and in the toddler room; and two (2) ceiling lights in the three-year-old room, were not in good repair.

There were dead bugs in the ceiling light fixture in the preschool room. Interview confirmed they were dead bugs.

A cell phone cord, and an extension cord was on the floor beside the children's toys in the three-year-old room.

The large 5X5 square toddler mat was frayed throughout in the toddler room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the toddler's drinking cups were washed and rinsed in the same handwashing sink used by staff and children, daily. Interview revealed these drinking cups were reused each day at meal time. These drinking cups were not cleaned in a sanitary manner.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled 08/08/19; a child enrolled 05/20/19, and a child enrolled 04/02/18, did not have an immunization certificate on file.



1140 - Enrollment Information

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:

- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled 08/08/19, did not have her physician information on file.

A child enrolled 02/07/18, did not have her preferred hospital information, her physician information and her emergency authorization on file.

General: Based on review of documentation, three (3) children on 10/14/19, and one (1) child on 10/15/19, did not have a documented departure time.

One (1) child on 10/14/19, and four (4) children on 10/15/19, did not have a documented arrival time.

The information was available for the public view and contained confidential medical information.

General: Based on review of documentation, the statement of deficiencies/plan of corrections were not posted for the current licensure year. The renewal dated 09/11/18, was posted; however, the center received two additional inspections with deficiencies documented. All the additional violations issued during the current licensure year were not posted.
