- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was an electrical box on the wall, approximately eight (8) inches above ground, in Room 102 that was not secured to the wall. The contents of the box was exposed. Also, in Room 102 (A2), there was a small stain on a ceiling tile, located in the left corner of room, that was indicitive of water damage.

General: Based on observation, the toilet rooms located in Rooms 109N and 110N were not ventilated to outside air; the vents were not functioning.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the food and drink served to children during lunch consisted of foods and drinks that the children brought from home. Based on interview, the center requires parents to supply lunches that satify the regulatory requirements specific to the meal components. However, many children were observed drinking beverages that were not milk. Interview with a staff member confirmed that most children drink water or juice for lunch and no milk is provided as a supplement to satisfy the milk requirement.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a one-year-old child was consuming a liquid from a bottle, while lying in a crib. Therefore, the child was not held while being fed the bottle.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, review of ten (10) children's files revealed five (5) of the ten (10) files failed to include contact information for the child's physician. Two (2) of the files also failed to include information regarding the parents' preferred hospital.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, an emergency evacuation plan was presented for review; however, there was no evidence that the document was submitted to the local emergency official in the last year.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of

COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the center failed to assure compliance with the emergency regulations specific to the current pandemic. Two (2) staff members were observed in the presence of children while failing to wear a facial mask; one (1) staff member was in Room 107N and one (1) staff member was in Room 110N. Although the emergency regulations prohibits the use of machine washable toys, there were three (3) large pillows and several pieces of doll clothing observed in Room 103N. Additionally, in Room 107N, there were cloth shapes on an interactive felt board.
