- 2. Staff (DOH: 06/07/19) has not obtained the six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation; therefore, the training was not obtained during the staff's first three (3) months of employment.
- 3. Staff (DOH: (07/01/16) has not obtained the six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation; therefore, the training was not obtained during the staff's first three (3) months of

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation presented to the surveyor, the surveyor found a child's (DOE: 10/19/20) enrollment information did not contain authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence and information to enable a person in charge to identify and contact the preferred hospital. Through interview, the surveyor learned that additional documentation giving consent for the receipt of emergency medical care and preferred hospital was not available for review.
