Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files revealed a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential was not presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member hired 11/17/16. Interview with director revealed she needed to obtain proof of education for this staff member.

320 - TB Verification **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
 - 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files revealed a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis or a copy of negative tuberculin results was not presented for review at the time of survey for three (3) staff members hired 6/5/17, 3/6/17, and 11/17/16. Interview with director revealed this documentation was not available for review at the time of survey. Continued review of staff files revealed the copy of negative tuberculin results presented for review at the time of survey for one staff member hired 4/10/17 was no longer current after 3/27/17.

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
 - (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files revealed documentation of six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation was not presented for review at the time of survey for two (2) staff members hired 11/21/16 and 4/10/17. Interview with director revealed all staff members are in the process of completing this training.

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulatory programming requirements. Observation of the Nursery revealed two infants asleep in bouncies. Interview with the staff revealed the two infants had been asleep "for awhile".

- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies;
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. Review of children's files revealed the written record for three (3) children enrolled 9/29/14, 8/28/17 and 2/2/15 failed to contain contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's family preferred hospital. Interview with owner/director revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.
